GUIDELINES FOR INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE

- Policy and procedures for the assurance of quality and standards of their own programmes and awards.
 - Commit themselves to the development of a culture which recognizes the importance of quality and QA
 - To achieve this HEIs have a strategy for continuous enhancement of quality.

- 2 For programmes and awards should have formal mechanisms for the
 - Design and content
 - Approval procedures
 - Periodic reviews (every 5 years)
 - Montoring of progress
 - achievement of students,
 - regular feedback from employers.

3 Assessment of students

- Designed to measure achievement of ILOs.
- Be appropriate for their purpose
- Using published criteria (handbooks, by-laws, course specification)
- Regulations and procedures applied consistently
- Students clearly informed about the assessment strategy
- Verification checks to ensure accuracy of procedures

4 Quality of teaching staff

- have the necessary skills and experience to transmit their knowledge and understanding effectively to students
- can access feedback on their own performance
- opportunities for continuous professional development
 - Teaching skills
 - Research skills
 - Student counselling
 - Ethical practices

- 5 Learning resources and student support to ensure that
 - Adequate and appropriate
 - Readily accessible
 - Designed with students' need in mind
 - Be routinely monitored for improving the effectiveness of the services

- 6. Information systems to collect, analyse, and use relevant information for the effective management of their programmes of study and other activities.
 - Student progression and success rates
 - Employability of graduates
 - Student satisfaction with their programmes
 - Effectiveness of teachers
 - Profile of student populations
 - Learning resources available.

7 Publish up-to-date information about programmes and awards

- Programmes on offer
- ILOs of programmes
- Qualifications they award
- Teaching, learning, assessment procedures they use
- Profile of current student population
- Learning resources and opportunities available
